I Want to Hear the Sound of the Waves



Bathsheba, Barbados

On Barbados' rugged east coast, Bathsheba is where the Atlantic makes itself heard. Watch powerful waves roll toward dramatic rock formations, explore the quiet seaside village, and experience a wilder side of Barbados far removed from the typical resort beach.

Hopkins, Belize

A small Caribbean village with deep Garifuna roots, Hopkins brings the beach together with culture, music, and flavor. Spend time along the shoreline, experience traditional drumming and Garifuna food, then venture toward nearby jungles and the Maya Mountains when you're ready to explore beyond the water.

San Juan + Loíza, Puerto Rico

Pair the energy of San Juan with the Afro-Puerto Rican culture and coastline of neighboring Loíza. Explore colorful streets, local food and historic neighborhoods, then head toward Loíza and Piñones for beaches, bomba rhythms, roadside kiosks, mangroves, and a completely different side of the island.

Give Me Mountains



Blue Mountains + Irish Town, Jamaica

Trade the beach for Jamaica's cool, misty mountains above Kingston. Explore lush trails and coffee estates, taste world-famous Blue Mountain coffee near its source, and stop in Irish Town for Jamaican food and sweeping views across the hills toward the sea.

Banff + Lake Louise, Alberta

Surrounded by the Canadian Rockies, Banff pairs a lively mountain town with some seriously dramatic scenery. Wander downtown, hike or ride into the mountains, then head to Lake Louise for turquoise water, towering peaks, paddling, skiing, and views that change completely with the season.

Salento + Cocora Valley, Colombia

Colorful Salento sits in Colombia's mountain-filled coffee region and serves as the gateway to spectacular Cocora Valley. Wander streets lined with brightly painted traditional architecture, visit nearby coffee farms, then head into the valley to see its enormous wax palms rising against the Andes.

I Want Somewhere Colorful



Willemstad, Curaçao

Willemstad brings color to nearly every corner, from the pastel waterfront of Punda to the murals and narrow streets of Otrobanda. Wander between markets, local restaurants, galleries and historic neighborhoods while taking in the Caribbean, African and European influences that have shaped the city.

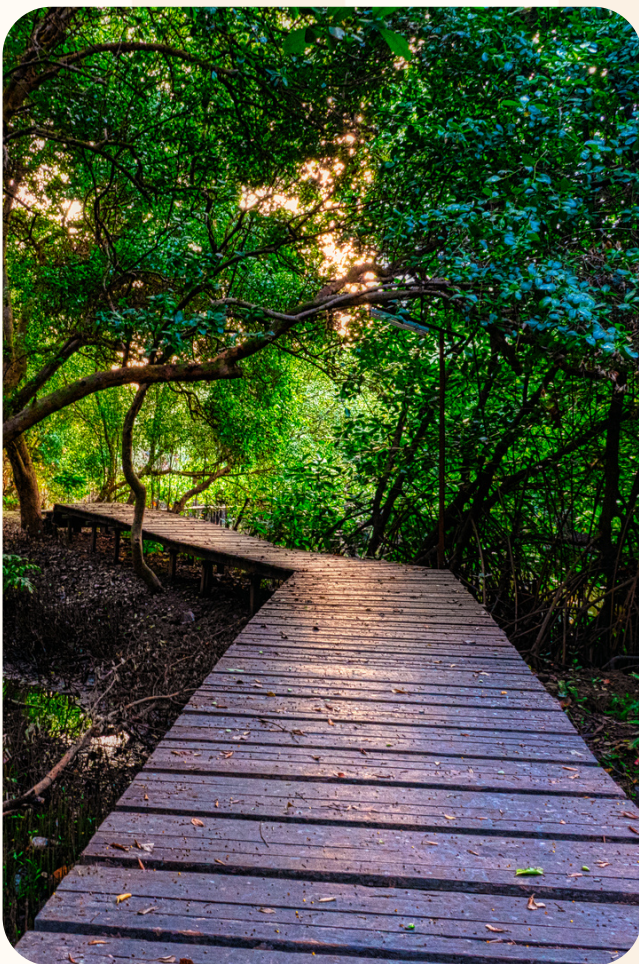
Bo-Kaap + Cape Town, South Africa

Set against the slopes above central Cape Town, Bo-Kaap is known for its brilliantly colored homes, cobblestone streets and deep Cape Malay heritage. Explore the neighborhood's history and landmarks, taste traditional Cape Malay dishes, then venture into greater Cape Town for markets, art and views of Table Mountain.

Little Haiti, Miami, Florida

Step beyond the usual Miami stops and into a neighborhood filled with Haitian and Afro-Caribbean culture. Explore colorful murals and galleries, browse Haitian art and crafts at the Caribbean Marketplace, taste Creole food, and experience the music, language and traditions that give Little Haiti its character.

I Want to Wander



Sapelo Island + Hogg Hummock, Georgia

Accessible only by ferry, Sapelo Island brings together undeveloped beaches, salt marshes and the living Gullah Geechee culture of Hogg Hummock. Explore the island with a local guide, learn about traditions preserved by descendants of West Africans enslaved there, then wander beneath moss-draped oaks or along the dunes of Nanny Goat Beach.

Gion + Higashiyama, Kyoto, Japan

Wander through narrow lanes lined with traditional wooden buildings, temples, shrines, gardens and small shops in one of Kyoto's best-preserved historic areas. Follow the streets from Gion into Higashiyama, stopping for local food and crafts along the way, or continue toward the Philosopher's Path and simply see where the day takes you.

Tremé, New Orleans, Louisiana

Wander beyond the French Quarter into one of the oldest Black neighborhoods in the United States and a place deeply connected to the roots of jazz. Explore Congo Square and Louis Armstrong Park, historic streets and neighborhood landmarks, then stop for Creole food and experience the music and culture that still shape Tremé today.

I Need Some Quiet



Jardin de Balata, Martinique

Tucked into the tropical hills above Fort-de-France, Jardin de Balata is filled with thousands of tropical plants, towering palms, colorful flowers and hummingbirds. Wander along shaded garden paths, cross suspended walkways through the treetops, and stop for views of the surrounding mountains and lush Caribbean landscape.

Trafalgar Falls, Dominica

Venture into Dominica's lush rainforest to find two dramatic waterfalls cascading through a landscape of mountains, tropical greenery and volcanic rock. Follow the forest trail to the viewing platform, listen to the water rushing through the jungle, and explore nearby hot springs for an experience that feels far removed from everyday life.

Fairbanks, Alaska — Northern Lights

Leave the city lights behind and head beneath Alaska's dark skies for the chance to watch the Northern Lights move overhead. Join an aurora-viewing tour, settle into a warm lodge or viewing spot, and spend a quiet night watching shades of green, purple and pink appear across the sky.

Take Me Somewhere That Doesn't Feel Like Home



St. Augustine Lighthouse, Florida

Climb 219 steps to the top of the historic St. Augustine Lighthouse, where sweeping views stretch across the Atlantic, waterways and the nation's oldest city. Explore the lighthouse and maritime museum below, then step onto the observation deck where the ocean breeze and panoramic coastline make everyday surroundings feel very far away.

The Louvre, Paris, France

Step inside a former royal palace and wander through grand halls filled with centuries of art, sculpture and history from around the world. Explore far beyond the museum's most famous works, then step back outside into the heart of Paris with the Seine, historic streets and some of the city's most recognizable landmarks nearby.

Heidelberg Castle + Old Town, Germany

Perched above the Neckar River, Heidelberg Castle overlooks a historic city filled with cobblestone lanes, centuries-old buildings and lively town squares. Explore the castle and its gardens, then head into Old Town to wander the streets, cross the Old Bridge and take in views that make modern everyday life feel very far away.
